

E-certificate for Participation in Webinar

NALSAR established the Centre for Aerospace and Defence Laws (CADL) in 2005 with the objective of promoting the development of research and education in the fields of aviation, space, maritime and defence laws and policies. Since then, NALSAR-CADL has been promoting the study of Aerospace and Defence Laws by introducing courses, conducting National and International Conferences, Moot Courts, Workshops and publishing Newsletters, Journals, Books and Articles, besides awarding M.Phil and Ph.D degrees.

CADL is organising a series of webinars titled “Aerospace and Defence Laws Lecture Series” to enhance the awareness on Aerospace and Defence Laws. The series is spread over 6 webinars. The first webinar is planned to discuss the need of Aerospace and Defence Education, and the rest of the series would focus on specific topics covering Aviation, Space, Defence and Security, Maritime, GIS and Remote Sensing laws.

NALSAR University of Law through CADL is issuing e-certificates to the participants to encourage the participants and enhance the research capabilities.

Categories of Certificates:

There are two types of e-certificates to be issued to the participants in this webinar series.

1. Certificate of Attendance
2. Certificate of Participation and Excellence

Certificate of Attendance:

This certificate is awarded to the candidate who attend at least 4 of the Webinars but not submit any article/write-up/paper.

Eligibility:

- Candidate must attend at least 4 webinars out of 6 conducted.

Certificate of Participation and Excellence:

This certificate is awarded to the Candidates based on the attendance and assessment. Candidate should score at least 50% marks to qualify for the Certificate of Participation and Excellence.

Eligibility:

- Candidate must attend at least 4 Webinars; and
- Candidate must submit a small write-up/research article in 1000-1500 words (excluding footnotes and bibliography) in any topic of their choice in either of Aviation or Space or Defence or Security or Maritime or GIS or Remote Sensing or any related area.

P.S. Write-up/paper/article is not required to be confined only to legal issues in the area.

Valuation:

- Attendance in each Webinar qualifies 5 marks and minimum of 20 Marks is required.
- The write-up/paper is evaluated for 70 Marks.

- The first part of the Aerospace and Defence laws lecture series is on 30 June, 2020. The subsequent webinars will be tentatively held on 7 July, 14 July, 21 July, 28 July, 4 August, 2020.

- Registration to each Webinar is mandatory.

Additional Information about Papers/write-ups:

- Few selected papers will be either published in our July-August edition of CADL Newsletter or in our new online Blog or in both.
- Interested Candidates can send full length Research paper (in around 2500 - 3000 words, excluding footnotes and Bibliography) for publication in our Bi-annual Journal “Indian Journal of Air and Space Law” (IJASL). However, Publication is subject to the approval of the editorial Board.
- Last date to send the paper to obtain Certificate of Participation and Excellence and to Newsletter is 15 August, 2020 by 8PM IST. However, Candidate can send their work for our Blog and Journal round the clock throughout the year.
- Candidate should e-mail their work to cadladmissions@nalsar.ac.in in Microsoft word format.

Guidelines for Paper submission

Length:

As specified above.

Formalities:

1. The mandatory formatting specifications for the papers/abstracts are:
 - 1-inch margin on all sides;
 - Times New Roman typeface with 12-point font size;
 - 1.5 line spacing
2. For footnotes, the mandatory formatting specifications shall be:
 - Times New Roman typeface with 10-point font size;
 - single (1) line spacing
3. Content/Format of the paper: (sample attached)
 - Title Page: The following elements must be included:
 - Title of the article;
 - Name(s) and initial(s) of author(s), preferably with first names spelled out;
 - Affiliation(s) of author(s);
 - Footnotes to the contribution title;
 - Name, address, telephone and fax numbers, and e-mail address of the corresponding author.
 - Abstract: Each article is to be preceded by a succinct abstract, of up to 200-300 words, that highlights the objectives, methods, results, and conclusions of the paper. (It can be exempted for paper less than 1500 words)
 - Article - Text, References, Figures, Tables, Appendices
4. Authorities must be cited throughout the paper using the format provided hereunder as Annexure-I.
5. Use the following formats for headings and sub-headings:
 - First-level head: centered with the first letter of each major word capitalized
 - Second-level head: flush with the left margin with the first letter of each major word capitalized
 - Third-level head: initial letter of each major word capitalized, italicized and flush to the left margin. Regular text follows period.

- Fourth-level head: initial letter of first word capitalized, italicized and indented. Regular text follows period.
6. No page breaks and section breaks are permitted.
 7. PLAGIARISM: Plagiarism is cause for immediate disqualification. The original content limit shall stay above 80 percent.
 8. Any paper failing to conform to the above specifications will be returned to the author(s) for revision before being considered for publication.
 9. Each paper submission must be accompanied by a cover letter, addressed to the Editor, expressing the author's intent and noting that the manuscript is not being considered for publication elsewhere. If there is more than one author, indicate clearly in the cover letter the one to whom correspondence should be addressed. (should be attached as a separate file in same email)
 10. Each paper submission must be accompanied by a biographical sketch for each author, not to exceed 150 words, outlining relevant educational and professional experiences. (should be attached as a separate file in same email)
 11. The copyright of the entry to the Journal/Book will rest with the Editorial Board once the entry has been selected and the authors(s) of the same have been notified.

TimeLine:

Paper shall be submitted on/before **the specified date (15th August, 2020)**. Late submissions are not encouraged.

Publication:

As specified in the email.

Paper Submission:

Completed Papers should be sent to cadladmissions@nalsar.ac.in. All required documents (Cover letter which includes declaration of originality and non-publication in other journals, document with author/s brief bio data and contact details, main article in prescribed format) should be attached in same email.

Paper should be sent only in Microsoft Word Format (.doc / .docx)

The subject of the email should be “paper submission – your name – area of paper (Air Law/ Space Law/ Defence Law/Maritime/ GIS & Remote Sensing)”.
