

Welcome to the Third edition of Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam Air and Space Law and Policy Essay Competition. Transport continues to play an important role in today's economy and society and has a large impact on growth and employment. The quality of transport services has a major impact on people's quality of life. Global crisis, including the COVID19 pandemic and the war in Ukraine, have only underscored the importance of resilient transport. The pandemic triggered massive disruptions to global transport and trade supply chains and undermined the financial viability of transport operators. As the world emerges from the pandemic and absorbs the impact of the war in Ukraine, it is critical to enhance the resilience of the transport sector.

Space too is transport: orbital, sub-orbital, transfer from one orbit to the next or the travel to destinations beyond Earth's orbit. The future of space transport lies in the reduction of cost, in flexible launch rates, in environmental friendliness, in space traffic management and in the safety of space assets.

The future of transport is based on the future of air, land, water and space transport.
